
Risks of OTC Meds



- Potential for Abuse
 - **▶** Ephedrine
 - Dextromethorphan
 - Accessibility
- Toxicity
- Side Effects
- Avoiding Seeing the Doctor
- Drug Interactions

Weighing Risks/Benefits

- Avoid unnecessary visit vs. Delay necessary treatment
 - ▶ 1-2 week limit
- ► Read the label!
- ► Know the active ingredients
- ► Talk to your Pharmacist




Analgesics

- What is an analgesic?
- ▶ What are some examples?
 - ► Salicylates (Aspirin) Bayer Aspirin
 - Acetaminophen (Tylenol)
 - ► Ibuprofen (Advil)
 - ► Naproxen (Aleve)
- What are some uses?
 - ► Aches not severe pain
 - ► NSAIDS useful for inflammation (i.e. joint pain, arthritis)
 - ► Fever (controversial)





Analgesic Side Effects



- ► NSAIDS/Aspirin
 - Rebound headaches
 - ► GI irritation
 - Blood thinning
 - Kidney stress
- Aspirin
 - Reye's Syndrome
- Acetaminophen
 - ► Liver failure

Cold, Cough, and Allergy Meds





- Decongestants (allergies and cold)
 - Pseudoephedrine (Sudafed)
 - Oxymetazoline (Afrin)
 - ► Spray vs. pill
- Antitussives (cough)
 - Dextromethorphan (Robitussin DM)
 - For nonproductive cough
- Expectorants (cough)
 - ► Guaifenesin (Mucinex)
 - ► For productive cough
- Antihistamines (allergies)
 - Diphenhydramine (Benadryl)
 - ► Loratadine (Claritin)









Cold, Cough, and Allergy Med Side Effects

- Antihistamines
 - Dizziness
 - Drowsiness (First generation vs. Second generation)
 - Impaired judgment
- Decongestants
 - ► Rebound congestion especially nasal sprays
 - Cardiovascular problems oral meds
- Dextromethorphan
 - Dizziness
 - Drowsiness
 - ► High dose hallucinations









Antacids and Anti-heartburn

- Examples
 - ► Calcium Carbonate (TUMS), Aluminum Salts and Magnesium Salts
 - ► Ranitidine (Zantac)
 - ► Famotidine (Pepcid)
 - Omeprazole (Prilosec)
- See Doctor if
 - ▶ Severe stomach pain, blood in stool, diarrhea, vomiting



Antacids and Anti-heartburn Side Effects

► Rebound reflux
