

Registration Requirements

Registration for 2019 Student Research Conference is from January 15-February 18 at noon.

The main things you'll need to register are:

- Presentation Format
- Title of your Presentation (100 Character limit)
- Abstract (300 word limit)
- Time of day you prefer to present (9:00-11:00, 11:00-1:00, 1:00-3:00, 3:00-5:00) - you are allowed two options and if you have unscheduled clinicals or time restraints, please put in comments at the end of the registration

Eligibility Requirements to Present

- Must be a matriculated student at the University of Vermont (undergraduate, post-bac, graduate, and medical students are accepted. If you would like to present but graduated in December, [please contact the SRC coordinator](#) within the registration timeline).
- Must have a faculty mentor at the University of Vermont (if your mentor is from another university, please [contact the SRC coordinator](#) before registering).
- Must be available for no less than one hour on the day of the conference (Wednesday 4/17/2019), major time constraints should be inputted into the "comments" portion of the registration form.
- Submissions are due on February 18 at noon.

Special & Competitive Sessions

- The registration form includes a box to check for being considered for competitive and special sessions. This is not a requirement but can add to the overall experience of the conference.
- Special Sessions: These are held by an organization, office, center, program, etc. and moderated by someone affiliated with that program. These are topic specific sessions as well as presentation format specific. Abstracts in the fields and areas of the topic are delivered to the affiliate and chosen by them. You will be informed of your invitation to participate in this special session. This can be considered an invitation to a panel for your resume or CV.
- Competitive Sessions: Hosted by the Office of the Vice President for Research, these sessions are judged by community remembers and potential employers and are loosely categorized. There is a box in the registration form that allows you to opt in or out of competitive sessions, by opting in you are not guaranteed a spot within a competitive session.
